

GUIDELINES FOR COMMUNION

Catholics need to remember the Church's traditional rules on the reception of Holy Communion. **Practicing Catholics** who are *spiritually prepared* (i.e. not conscious of mortal sin on their souls) may approach the altar rail to make a *worthy* Communion. If one has been away from Masses of Obligation (due to one's own fault) or if there is another reason for being ill prepared, the Sacrament of Penance (Confession) is necessary *before* the reception of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord. We should always approach this awesome Eucharistic Mystery with souls empty of grave sin and *full* of great love. As in the awesome Incarnational Mystery of the Word-made flesh in the stable of Bethlehem, here holy fear and deep love co-mingle. **Catholic couples** in cohabitation (living together without the Sacrament) are advised not to receive Holy Communion. These brothers and sisters of ours are of deep pastoral concern to the Church. Hopefully they will soon take steps to rectify their situation.

WAFA ALSAHOURI, FROM BETHLEHEM CHRISTIAN FAMILIES, <u>https://theshepherdandthelostsheep.net</u> will be with us this Sunday after both Masses in the parish center. Wafa is here to ask for your help and prayers for the native people of the Holy Land in Bethlehem. These families, sixty years ago, made up 18% of the population. Due to recent events in the Middle East, these families face devastating economic strain. Their population has decreased to less than 2% in the Holy Land. They have relied on the income from selling their religious objects, hand carved from olivewood to tourists. We have come to the USA to try to help support these families by selling their artwork here. All the proceeds from sales will be sent back to the families of the Holy Land so that they may be able to keep their homes and provide for their families. The last few years have been very tough for the Christian families. This is their only source of income.

We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

THE FIRST READING Ez 17:22-24

Thus says the Lord GOD: I, too, will take from the crest of the cedar, from its topmost branches tear off a tender shoot, and plant it on a high and lofty mountain; on the mountain heights of Israel I will plant it. It shall put forth branches and bear fruit, and become a majestic cedar. Birds of every kind shall dwell beneath it, every winged thing in the shade of its boughs. And all the trees of the field shall know that I, the LORD, bring low the high tree, lift high the lowly tree, wither up the green tree, and make the withered tree bloom. As I, the LORD, have spoken, so will I do.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

R. Lord, it is good to give thanks to you.

THE SECOND READING 2 Cor 5:6-10

Brothers and sisters: We are always courageous, although we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord, for we walk by faith, not by sight. Yet we are courageous, and we would rather leave the body and go home to the Lord. Therefore, we aspire to please him, whether we are at home or away. For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each may receive recompense, according to what he did in the body, whether good or evil.

GOSPEL Mk 4:26-34

Jesus said to the crowds: "This is how it is with the kingdom of God; it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how. Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come." He said, "To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches,

so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade." With many such parables he spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it. Without parables he did not speak to them, but to his own disciples he explained everything in private.

CREDO I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, *AND BY THE HOLY SPIRIT WAS INCARNATE OF THE VIRGIN MARY AND BECAME MAN*. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins, and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

COLLECT O Lord, let peace guide the course of world events, that your Church may serve you in joy and security. Through Jesus Christ.

EPISTLE

Brethren: I consider the sufferings of the present time unworthy to be compared with the glory that one day will be revealed in us. Even creation itself is waiting with eager longing for that revelation of the sons of God. For creation was condemned to a futile existence, not willingly, but by the will of him who doomed it. Yet hope still remained that even creation itself would be delivered from its slavery to corruption and would come to share in the glorious liberty of the children of God. Up to the present, as we know, the whole of creation has been groaning together as it undergoes the pains of childbirth. And not only creation, but we ourselves also groan in our hearts, for, even though we have the Spirit as first fruits of our harvest, we are still waiting for the full adoption that will come to us through the redemption of our bodies: in Christ Jesus our Lord.

GRADUAL Pardon our sins O Lord; why should the nations say, "Where is their God?" Help us, O God our savior; because of the glory of your name, O Lord, deliver us.

ALLELUIA Alleluia, alleluia. O God, seated on your throne, judging justly: be a stronghold for the oppressed in times of distress. Alleluia.

GOSPEL At that time as Jesus stood by the Lake of Genesareth and the crowd pressed upon him to hear the word of God, he saw two boats moored by the side of the lake; the fishermen had disembarked and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to pull out a short distance from the shore. Then he sat down and went on teaching the crowds from the boat. When he finished speaking he said to Simon: Put out into the deep water and lower your nets for a catch. Simon answered: Master, we worked hard at it all night long and caught nothing; but at your word I will lower the nets." Upon doing so they caught a great number of fish, and their nets were at breaking point. They signaled to their mates in the other boat to come and help them. These came and they filled both boats to the point of sinking. At the sight of this Simon Peter fell at the knees of Jesus, saying: "Depart from me because I am a sinful man, Lord." For amazement at the haul of fish which they had seized him and all his companions, and also James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Jesus said to Simon: "Do not be afraid. From now on you will be catching men." Then they brought their boats to land, left everything, and followed him.


OFFERTORY Give light to my eyes that I may never sleep in death, lest my enemy say, "I have overcome him."

PRAYER TO ST JOSEPH by St. Francis de Sales


